



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Part I: Scope and Impact of Year 1



WHAT: The One Home Journey 2024-2030 is a 7-year journey reaching out to every country on Earth:

- to support and connect Earth Citizens and their initiatives, across all borders to care for the Earth and for each other, and
- to draw on the cultural wealth, Indigenous wisdom and local innovations of all countries to jointly shape a future of planetary peace and wellbeing for all.

WHY: Life on Earth is in danger.

But the greatest danger is to despair that there is nothing we can do. Everywhere, humanity is rising to take the journey from devastation and division to regeneration and unity - as the first year of the One Home Journey shows.



HOW: The One Home Journey focused on 3 levels of "Home" based Activities:

1. Inner Home

- Attuning to the regenerative Power of Nature: at
- Heeding Indigenous Knowlege Holders and Perennial Wisdom Keepers
 - Impact: 25 Indigenous Elders' wisdom messages for our future
- Witnessing the Dreams of 7 Year Olds for 7 Generations
 - Impact: 930 Children as emerging Earth Citizens: painting, voicing and seeding future dreams

2. Recognizing and Catalysing Local Homes for Humantiy:

- Living with and learning from exemplary Homes for Humanity
- Engaging with Paradigm-shifting organisations and initiatives and recognising them as Homes for Humanity
 - Impact: 40 new Homes for Humanity: local organisations recognised for their contribution and personal, local and planetary impact.
- Catalysing Future Builders participating in the One Home UnivEARTHsity and supporting Youth for the Future and "Women for the Earth" Fellows
 - Impact: 1415 in Inter-generational Earth Citizens Quests:
 - 970 youth & 445 women

3. Co-Creating Earth Home

- Co-convening an Earth Agora of local Earth Citizens to harvest their visions, initiatives and commitments to co-create Home on Earth in their communities, country and the world, including Earth Artists, Unity Gardens, and a Culminating Earth Family Call
 - o Impact: 26 Unity Gardens: planted in 20 countries, with over 7 000 participants
 - Impact: Over 11 000 Earth Citizens: participated across all 20 countries



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Part I: Scope and Impact of Year 1

WHAT WE FOUND: in Year 1, April 2024 to August 2025

The Co-Founders of Home for Humanity lived and worked "home to home", learning from and supporting diverse communities - from urban slums to Indigenous villages, refugee camps to ecovillages, universities to enterprises.

Alongside the unique wisdom and innovations of each culture, most striking were: 7 Findings in common, expressed widely across all 20 countries in Year 1:

- Care for the Earth: instinctive love and care for our one home, across all ages
- **Belonging**: "we are all connected" as a family of life on Earth
- Hospitality & Generosity: pride in welcoming strangers, gifting and sharing
- **Healing:** transcending trauma by ensuring "no one else suffers what I/we faced"
- Agency & Responsibility: taking initiative despite all odds, not awaiting help
- Co-creating: new initiatives of inclusion v/s fighting old divisive systems All Humanity, all Life, and our One Earth are treasures to be cherished

Key Finding: EARTH CITIZENS RISE

Above all, Year 1 of the One Home Journey showed that people everywhere:

- feel a sense of belonging to an interdependent family of life on Earth;
- express the urgency for humanity to come together, in these times of great peril and great possibility, to care, as Earth Citizens for the Earth and each other;
- are excited to connect, co-learn and co-create in a common platform where all their local wisdom, experiences and innovations contribute to a shared future of planetary peace and wellbeing for all life.

In Summary: "EARTH CITIZENS" are rising everywhere on Earth, across generations, cultures and backgrounds. They are responding to local and planetary crises not by protesting or passively awaiting outside help, but by taking initiative and collective responsibility.

EARTH CITIZENS describes all the diverse individuals who take care simultaneously:

- of the Earth, our shared home, and the diverse family of life;
- of each other, in their local communities and across all cultures;
- of themselves, by fulfilling their purpose and living lives of service, guided by their values.

Part II: Provisional Outlook for 2026-2030

Towards Earth Citizenship for Planetary Peace and Wellbeing

Based on these findings from Year 1, we envision, for 2026 to 2030, a full focus of the One Home Journey on EARTH CITIZENSHIP for Planetary Peace and Wellbeing for all life on Our One Home, Earth. Our main programme areas might include:

- Homes for Humanity: honouring and championing innovative, and courageous local initiatives that care holistically for people, community and the Earth.
- Unity Gardens for Peace with Nature and All Cultures: to experience and care for biological and cultural diversity, and the interconnectedness of all life.
- Earth Citizens' Quests: Inter-generational, experiential, life-based 3-day learning journeys, and a Children's Quest to paint dreams and plant gardens (1/2 day).
- The One Home UnivEARTHsity: co-creating as Earth Citizens a free, common platform for the collective learnings of the Journey, across all countries.
- Transformative Public Performances, Films & Books: sharing the unfolding story of humanity's journey for our One Home Earth, to engage & inspire action.

Combined Impact on a Glance

In Our One Home Journey's first year – working with Homes for Humanity and local and Indigenous communities across 20 countries, and in collaboration with our planetary partners in civil society, we made significant strides towards our shared goal of co-creating an inclusive and regenerative future for all of life on Earth.

Our collective impact and achievements are:

- 20 COUNTRIES across 5 WORLD REGIONS
- 10,975 PEOPLE of all ages and backgrounds directly participated
- 930 CHILDREN voiced and painted their dreams for our shared future on Earth

Launching Community-led Unity Gardens

Unity Gardens are a Planetary Participatory Initiative on the One Home Journey 2024-2030: 7 Years for 7 Generations initiated by the Home for Humanity Movement for Planetary Regeneration. The aim is to create Unity Gardens in every country on Earth to foster unity and peace: within us, between us and with all life on Earth. In every Unity Garden, local plants or trees are planted to represent every country on Earth, and to appreciate the unique values and gifts each of our diverse cultures contributes to our common future. In the first pilot year n of the One Home Journey, diverse communities came together in each country to jointly initiate Unity Gardens. These were joyful occasions marked by 'earth citizenship', intergenerational participation, social cohesion and inter-cultural unity.







FINANCIAL REPORT YEAR 1 2024 - 2025

The first Pilot Year of the One Home Journey was conducted with a minimal budget to enable this collective planetary undertaking to start. Initial funds ("financial gifts") received, primarily from individual well-wishers and small foundations from different countries, were supplemented by zero-interest loans of the Co-Initiators of the One Home Journey. Almost all gifts were not earmarked for specific activities on the One Home Journey, but for the overall operation. Financial Gifts Raised were "matched" with In-Kind Gifts in the ratio of about 1:10, as local hosts and supported made immense contributions to the One Home Journey through the gift of hospitality, event organisations, free venue use, and the gift of time. Overall, the first pilot year was an extraordinary validation of the gift economy model, with which the journey is "fueled"




